# FROM OUR CEO & PRESIDENT JASON DEABUENO



This quarter, my family experienced heartache. Within four days, I attended the funerals for my uncle (62) who passed away from COVID-19, and my cousin (29) passed away due to a break-in in his home.

My uncle was like my older brother. Along with working at the Air Force Academy for 30 years, he became a Harley-Davidson master technician. At the Catholic service, I recalled that it was his influence that sparked my interest in motorcycles. In the backdrop of the service, there were slides of the motorcycles he owned. It was beautiful; but I wondered if this would have been the way he would have wished to be celebrated? I was at a loss to know. What also confused me was when his co-worker sang a song that touched me at the core to the point that, when he was done, I clapped. Yikes, I was the only one who did...awkward!

Fast forward, I am now at my cousin's funeral. In this service, our family decided that we would have a theme for his funeral. He was an OVER-THE-TOP fan of the Raiders. There were stories shared about him and his love of the game. There were moments of laughter, crying and many emotions running wild. He was an artist and produced many songs and when one was played, it was a rush of energy! At the end, people cheered and clapped. I remained silent as I recalled the awkward moment at my uncle's funeral. Yikes.

Why, you might wonder, am I sharing these stories? The reason is that from both funerals I have gained additional clarity about how I would update my Five Wishes document. Recall, Five Wishes is end-of-life care planning so that family members do not need to guess about your wishes. First, I would give permission at the onset that people can clap if they so desire for any presentations that move them.
