Companionship volunteers require a criminal background check, drug screen, Division of Motor Vehicle check, copy of a valid driver's license, up-to-date auto insurance, volunteer orientation, and ongoing specialized training. **Silver Key Senior Services** provides compassionate, reassuring, expert-level care delivering a sense of home and hope to seniors in El Paso county. Your donation directly serves between 8-9,000 of your senior neighbors every year.

To help with these invaluable services, please donate to Silver Key before Dec. 31, 2023, to maximize your tax benefits. Taxpayers can deduct charitable contributions from total taxable income, reducing the total tax owed at tax time. Donors who are 70  $\frac{1}{2}$  or older are eligible to give up to a maximum of \$100,000 per year from their IRA directly to a qualified charity and potentially lower their overall income tax while meeting the minimum qualified distribution.

Below is a testimonial from Ron Burge, a U.S. Army veteran and Companionship volunteer.

#### Soldier's Dedication:Ron Burge's Inspiring Journey

As I recently achieved the official title of a "Senior" in the community [I recently turned 65 years young] I have been asked to give a testimonial of my experience at Silver Key. Having never been asked this question before, I turned to my experience as a soldier in the United States Army as my motivation to put thoughts to paper.

I spent 23 years in the military and it was in part due to this achievement, I was asked to volunteer in a program at Silver Key by a dear friend on the staff at Silver Key. They created a program to support elderly military Veterans in our city and reached out to other Vets as potential companions. A few years back the Army coined a phase that supports my desire in volunteerism that states I am a "Soldier For Life". Being a soldier that served our country was an honor and even though I do not wear a uniform any longer I feel the need to serve as a primary function in my daily responsibilities. Whether it is providing support to the local church or any number of community needs, serving creates a positive purpose in my life while I adjust to retirement. The Companionship Program at Silver Key filled a

void that I had and it allowed me to further support a directive the military formed from my very first day after taking my oath of service. "Never leave a comrade on the field of battle" was driven into our brain from day one of basic training. All service members learned this crucial aspect of their duties and I have continued to support this rationale in my volunteer duties. The "battlefield" for the elderly today is isolation, depression, and loneliness. Having someone to build a bridge to connect with the elderly is how I continue to serve.

I am allowed to use a creative mind set and show my



elderly Veterans aspects of life that they can't quite complete on their own due to aging and a shortage of opportunities. We attend ball games, go fishing, or simply partake in a nice meal and reminisce about places we've traveled and experiences we have shared. Every day I find a wealth of enjoyment in interacting with seniors. Their insights on life and their experiences are fascinating and allow me to better serve them and their needs. I have found that with just a little creative motivation, a person confined to a wheelchair can still enjoy a trip to the mountains or take in a Broncos game.

I have chaperoned an elderly Vet to visit his ailing father one more time out of state and the joy of watching this scenario take place was beyond words. I consider myself a

overachiever" that looks forward to future opportunities to serve and wakes up every day with a new motivation and a desire to create new memories for my elderly friends. My grandmother once told me "there aren't any U-Hauls going to Heaven". It took my many years to fully comprehend what she meant by this statement. We can't take our belongings with us, only memories and the knowledge that helping someone is the ultimate gift one takes with them at the end.

I hope that I am creating some memories for my senior friends; I know they have given me a wealth of satisfaction I'll hold dear until my days are gone. Thank you for this opportunity to serve our seniors and this community."
